## **GRAVE DECORATIONS**

## Evergreen and Memorial Gardens Cemeteries

The following rules minimize interference with gravesite maintenance activities and help preserve the general aesthetics of the cemeteries.

**Fences or hedges** are not permitted on or around any gravesite.

**Uneven surfaces** or permanent objects such as mounds, berms, bricks, rocks, etc. are not permitted.

**Solar lights** may be placed in the ground only if immediately adjacent to an above-ground monument (not adjacent to a lawn-level marker). They may also be placed off the ground in an urn or flowerpot. To preserve the dignity of the cemetery, flashing or otherwise active lights will be removed.

**Live flowers and small decorative live greenery** (not to include shrubs, arborvitae, etc.) may be planted in the ground immediately adjacent to a monument or marker, preferably to the right or left.

**Christmas wreaths and decorations** are allowed starting November 15<sup>th</sup> and must be removed no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>, after which they will be discarded. Other holiday/seasonal decor will be allowed two weeks before the holiday to two weeks after. Items left outside this period will be disposed of.

**Live or artificial flowers and decorative greenery** kept in a large, permanent flowerpot on the ground, in an urn on a stand, or hanging from a shepherd's hook are permitted year-round. They must be immediately adjacent to the left or right side of a monument or marker. Standard shepherd's hooks are for hanging plants, only, and are not to be decorated in any way. Items left hanging on shepherd's hooks after Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> will be discarded. **Flowerpots must be maintained in an attractive manner** and used for their intended purpose or they will be subject to removal and disposal.

Artificial flowers and decorative greenery, and objects such as toys or personal belongings may be temporarily placed on a gravesite during the period commencing the day before Mother's Day (2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in May) through the day after Father's Day (3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in June). Items left on a gravesite outside this period will be disposed of by cemetery staff.

Glass items are not allowed in the cemeteries and will be immediately removed and discarded.

Items attached to trees or hanging from bushes are not permitted.

One flag-holder or official metallic tablet of the Grand Army of the Republic, or other similar organizations whose membership is limited to those who served in the military forces of the U.S.A., will be permitted upon a grave. See the Rules & Regulations brochure for more details on these and other non-military insignia.

**One small U.S. flag** in good condition no larger than 8 x 12 inches with a maximum 24 inch staff is permitted per individual grave. Faded or tattered flags will be removed.

Only one grave decoration (including urn stands) per individual grave is allowed.
